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1. VENUE

- 1.1 The championship will take place at the NWU McArthur Athletics Stadium, Potchefstroom from Thursday 31 March 2022 to Saturday 02 April 2022.
- 1.2 The stadium has an eight-lane synthetic track around and a ten-lane track in the straight, with facilities for all athletics events.

2. GENERAL

- 2.1 The meeting will be conducted under the rules of World Athletics (WA) and ASA.
- 2.2 ASA Health and Safety Protocols (**Addendum A**) during Athletics Competition will be followed. ASA Checklist to be COVID-19 compliant for Training and Competition (**Addendum B**) is added to the Manual.
Prior to entering the competition facilities each athlete, official, stakeholder and/or spectator must complete the online health and covid-19 questionnaire at the following link:

You will receive an email with your declaration that you must present at the stadium gate to allow entry into the stadium.
If you have no access to internet, each person will be required to fill in the questionnaire at the stadium gate. (To avoid delays and long queues, kindly fill in the online questionnaire).
- 2.3 Deadline for submission of all entry forms from Provinces is **Wednesday, 16 March 2022. Please note that no hard copies will be accepted. Faxed or scanned entries will be rejected and the athletes will not be entered for the competition.**
- 2.4 The Championships are open for all ASA provincial members. Only athletes with a valid SA ID-number will be allowed to enter. This implies that all athletes should be registered members of a club and in possession of a 2022 ASA license number (or as determined by ASA).
- 2.5 **Addendum D** – ASA World U/20 Qualification System and Entry Standards.
- 2.6 Competition is for the following age groups only (WA Technical Rule 3.1):
 - 2.6.1 Only athletes aged 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 or 19 on 31 December 2022 (born in 2008, 2007, 2006, 2005, 2004 and 2003) may compete in their respective age group events.
 - 2.6.2 The maximum number of events in which an athlete can compete in during the championships is two (2) events.
- 2.7 **Under 16 Age Group** - 14 or 15 years on 31 December 2022 (born in 2008 or 2007)
- 2.8 **Under 18 Age Group** - 16 or 17 years old on 31 December 2022 (born in 2006 or 2005)
- 2.9 **Under 20 Age Group** - 18 or 19 Years old on 31 December 2022 (born in 2004 or 2003)
- 2.10 **Athletes must participate in the event(s) they wish to represent South Africa, should they be selected.**

- 2.11 Entries without an ID-number, or a birth certificate, in the case of athletes younger than 16 years, will not be accepted, and it will be returned to the Province. **Please have copies of ID documents/birth certificates available at number collection.**
- 2.12 **Implements:** Competitors may use their own implements, provided these are checked before competition by the Technical Manager. These implements can only be used by other athletes with the permission of the owner of the implement (competition specific rule). Personal implements, with the owner's name on it, must be handed in at the equipment room not later than 3 hours before the official starting time of the event. No competitor shall be permitted to take any implement into the arena. At the end of the competition, athletes shall leave the field carrying their own implements.
- 2.13 **Pole Vault:** Poles must be delivered at the Equipment Room no later than 3 hours before the official starting time of the event, or as the Technical Meeting decide. Each pole or bag must be clearly marked with the name and competition number of the athlete and the event number. After the inspection the Technical Staff shall deliver the poles to the competition area in time for the athlete's warm-up. At the end of the competition, athletes shall leave the field carrying their own poles.
- 2.14 Athletes are not permitted to have in their possession cell phones, cassette recorders, radio, iPods, MP3s etc., or any other communication device, in the competition arena (WA TR 6.3.2).
- 2.15 At the competition area before the beginning of the event, each field athlete may have practice trials. In the case of throwing events, the practice trials will be in draw order and always under the supervision of the Judges (WA TR 25.1).
- 2.16 Once the competition has begun, competitors are not permitted to use implements, runways or circles for practice or warm-up purposes (WA TR 25.2).
- 2.17 All competition shoes must comply with the World Athletics Technical Rules (TR 5.2 – 5.6) and the Athletic Shoe Regulations approved by the World Athletics Council on 22 December 2021. Where any Referee has a reasonable suspicion that a shoe worn by an athlete in a competition might not comply with the letter or the spirit of the Rules, the Referee may request, and the athlete must immediately hand over the shoe to the Referee at the conclusion of the event, for further investigation (WA TR 5.12).
- 2.18 A competitor shall be excluded from further participation in the championships in cases where:
- 2.18.1 A final confirmation was given that the athlete would start in an event but then failed to participate (WA TR 4.4.1).
- 2.18.2 He/she qualified in preliminary rounds or heats for further participation in an event but then failed to participate further (WA TR 4.4.2).
- 2.18.3 **Note: Athletes, who withdraw from an event during the championships due to medical reasons, will only be considered for selection to represent South Africa, if cleared by a medical doctor and a fitness test was done under the supervision of an ASA Delegate.**



2.19 Heats and Qualifications:

- 2.19.1 As soon as an athlete has achieved the qualification standard, he/she shall be requested to leave the field, accompanied by a Judge. All other athletes shall leave the field together, accompanied by a Judge when the event finishes.
- 2.19.2 In qualifying rounds of field events, if less than 12 competitors reach the required qualification standard, the first 12 and every competitor tying for the 12th place will be entitled to compete in the finals. In the 800m track events, 10 athletes and from 1500m and longer events, 12 athletes will go through to the finals.
- 2.19.3 In all field events and track events from and including 1500m, if only 12 competitors or less are entered for an event, there will be no qualifying rounds, and all competitors will go directly to the final.
- 2.19.4 Due to the duration of Vertical Jump events, there will be starting heights in the qualifying rounds.

2.20 Publication of Results:

5. ASSISTANCE TO ATHLETES

- 5.1 At all races from 800 meters and above, intermediate times will be displayed on an electronic board located close to the finish line.
- 5.2 In Track Events of 5000m and longer water will be provided to athletes on the track if weather conditions warrant it (WA TR 17.15.1)
- 5.3 No coaches or Team Managers will be allowed in the infield however athletes will be allowed to communicate with their coaches outside the competition area (WA TR 6.4.1)



6. ATHLETES CONTROL CENTRE

- 6.1 The call room for the athletes will be situated at the warm up area. All athletes must report to the call-room. If an athlete is entered in both track and field events which takes place simultaneously, the Team Manager must report this to the Control Room at least one (1) hour prior to the start of the first event.
- 6.2 When the control has been completed an official will accompany the athletes to the waiting area and final control point.
- 6.3 Only athletes and official Team Managers will be allowed in the call room (i.e. no parents, coaches etc.)
- 6.4 Athletes call out times will be as follows:

Event	Call Room	Entry on the field
Field events	60-minutes before the starting time	35-minutes before the starting time [except for Pole Vault]
Pole Vault	80-minutes before the starting time	65-minutes before the starting time
Track events	35-minutes before the starting time	10-minutes before the starting time
Hurdles	35-minutes before the starting time	15-minutes before the starting time

- 6.5 At registration, 2 bib numbers will be issued to each athlete. During the competition, athletes must always wear the numbers in their original shape and size properly secured on the four corners with the exception of athletes in the Jumping Events where only one number is compulsory (WA TR 5.7). **Any athlete who does not respect these rules will not be allowed to compete.**
- 6.6 Competitors taking part in track events might be given a supplementary number which they must attach on the right hip (WA TR 5.10).
- 6.7 Custody of Clothing:

All competitors competing in track events will receive a basket at the start for his/her clothes. Basket carriers will take the basket to the mixed zone. There will be a lane mark on each basket in order to make it easier for the athletes to locate their basket after the event.

7. RECORDS

Provincial teams are requested to provide the TIC with a list of provincial records for each event. If provincial teams want a provincial record ratified this must be arranged with the competition secretary and where anti-doping control is required the provincial teams will be responsible for the cost of those test. It is advisable that provincial Team Managers provide the TIC with their provincial record application forms at the Technical Meeting.

8. VICTORY CEREMONY

- 8.1 The first three athletes in each final event must report to the victory ceremonies area 30 minutes before the time of the victory ceremony. The victory ceremony will be held according to the victory ceremony program distributed at the technical meeting. All COVID-19 regulations will be followed.
- 8.2 Please note that athletes must be dressed in their provincial colours (full track suit and sneakers), as the victory ceremony is part of the competition. Failure to comply will result in the athlete not being allowed to be part of the ceremony (WA TR 5.1).

9. TECHNICAL DATA

- 9.1 Electronic timing will be used, and hand timing will be provided as a back- up.
- 9.2 A video recording may be used as back-up for Place Judges and during appeals
- 9.3 The measurement of distances at the field events shall be by means of a fibre measuring tape, but all records will be measured by a steel measuring tape. We are also looking at introducing laser measuring devices at these Championships for all field events
- 9.4 The starting heights and increments for High Jump and Pole Vault will be available at the Technical Meeting.

10. TECHNICAL / TEAM MANAGERS MEETING

- 10.1 The Technical/ Team Managers Meeting will take place as follows:

Date: Wednesday, 30 MARCH 2022

Time: 17:30

Venue: NWU McARTHUR Athletics Stadium, POTCHEFSTROOM

- 10.2 The Meeting will be open by the Track and Field Chairperson and chaired by the ASA Technical Delegate. The following officials or delegates should be in attendance: -
- Technical Delegate
 - One (1) representative from each Province;
 - The Competition Management;
 - The members of Jury of Appeal;
 - All National Technical Officials and Referees;
 - Representatives of the LOC;
 - ASA Delegates.
- 10.3 All Team Managers must collect their team's race numbers from 12h00 – 16h00 on Wednesday 30 March 2022 at the **NWU McARTHUR Athletics Stadium, POTCHEFSTROOM**. Final confirmation of athletes entered must be given at that time. Any withdrawals and corrections should also be addressed during that time as no further corrections will be accepted at any day after the commencement of the competition. No late entries will be accepted after 16 March 2022.
- 10.4 Any further withdrawals of athletes for specific events must be done by 16:00 on the day prior to the competition, as draw sheets will then be compiled for the next day of competition.

11. ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

- 11.1 Anti-doping control will be conducted on each day of competition in accordance with the WA Procedural Guidelines for Anti-doping Control under the supervision of ASA Anti-doping Control Delegate and the SA Institute for Drug Free Sport.
- 11.2 On receiving written notification of a test, the athlete will be permanently accompanied by an Anti-doping Control chaperone, and shall have to report to the Anti-doping Control station within 60 minutes.
- 11.3 Athletes will be allowed to first participate in any medal ceremony or press conferences before reporting to the Anti-doping Control Station.
- 11.4 Sample collection will be carried out in compliance with existing guidelines. Professionally qualified personnel, who will explain the procedure to the athletes and make them sign a consent form, will carry out the urine test.
- 11.5 Athletes are entitled to be accompanied to the Anti-doping Control Centre by one person of their choice. Personal identification must be presented.

- 11.6 Any athlete who has not been selected for testing may request testing. Athletes concerned should report to the TIC, and will then be escorted to the Anti-doping Control Centre. Cost for such tests will be entirely the responsibility of the athlete's respective province.

12. MEDICAL SERVICES

- 12.1 A full emergency medical service with an ambulance will be available at the stadium.
- 12.2 Physiotherapists will be available at the medical centre and at the warm up area.
- 12.3 Athletes who belong to a medical scheme must bring their membership cards in case they are required due to injuries.

13. PROTESTS AND APPEALS

- 13.1 Protest shall be made in accordance with WA Technical Rule 8. During the course of the event an athlete or his/her Team Manager may lodge a verbal protest to the appropriate Referee.
- 13.2 All appeals must be made in writing on the prescribed appeal form, which can be obtained from the Technical Information Centre (TIC). All appeal forms must be signed by the athlete or Team Manager.
- 13.3 The appeal must be submitted to the TIC, accompanied by a deposit of R500, no later than 30 minutes after the official announcement of the results, which is the defined time when the result are posted on the official Results links.

14. TECHNICAL INFORMATION CENTRE

The TIC will be located in the main stadium.

15. TECHNICAL MANAGER'S OFFICE

- 15.1 The office of the Technical Manager is located at the stadium.
- 15.2 The Technical Manager's/ assizing room is situated under the main pavilion of the stadium and will be clearly marked.

16. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

- 16.1 Provinces are requested to nominate a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 5 Technical Officials to officiate at the championships. Not all nominated Technical Officials will necessary be placed.
- 16.2 These Technical Officials must be part of the provincial team, their travelling and accommodation will be the responsibility of their respective province.



- 16.3 ASA will be responsible for the remuneration of the Technical Officials for all days of competition.
- 16.4 Please submit the names of your Technical Officials on the form supplied, with their preferred placing. Technical Officials will not necessary be placed as preferred.
- 16.5 The dress code for the championships will be a white golf shirt and a black pants or skirt.
- 16.6 Technical Officials must report 90 minutes before the start of competition on each day of the championships

17. VISITS TO THE STADIUM

- 17.1 A visit to the stadium shall be organized for Team Managers to show the exact location of the main facilities.
- 17.2 The visit shall take place at 15h00, before the Technical Meeting on Wednesday, 30 March 2022.
- 17.3 No warm ups or practicing will be allowed on the track on the eve of competition. The warm up area will be available to athletes.
- 17.4 COVID–19 Protocols will be followed during this exercise (wear of masks/sanitizing/social distance).

18. SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

Athletes and Team Managers (according COVID–19 protocols) will be seated on the stand exclusively reserved for this purpose. Details will be available at the Technical Meeting.

19. ACCESS CONTROL (Disaster Management Regulations)

Note: Event Accreditation will be available at the registration table prior to the event. All requests for accreditation must be submitted by provincial federations to the event organiser at the date and time that will be communicated.

- 19.1 Athletes and Team Managers will be provided with event accreditation (QR Code) that will be scanned upon entry and exit of the facility.
- 19.2 All affiliated coaches will be provided with event accreditation (QR Code) that will be scanned upon entry and exit of the facility.
- 19.3 All stadium staff and officials will be provided with event accreditation (QR Code) that will be scanned upon entry and exit of the facility.
- 19.4 All Stakeholders and guests will be provided with event accreditation (QR Code) that will be scanned upon entry and exit of the facility.
- 19.5 All service providers will be provided with event accreditation (QR Code) that will be scanned upon entry and exit of the facility.
- 19.6 All media representatives will be provided with event accreditation (QR Code) that will be scanned upon entry and exit of the facility.
- 19.7 Limited spectator tickets will be sold online at <https://myathletics.co.za/asa/> at a cost of R50 per person per day.
- 19.8 2000 spectators, officials, athletes and stakeholders (*COVID-19 regulations might change and numbers will be adjusted accordingly) will be allowed at any one time inside the stadium. There will be NO provisional seating for athletes and Team Managers.
- 19.9 Digital COVID-19 declarations and POPI Act consent forms will be available.
- 19.10 Real time reporting on the number of persons inside the facility will be available during the course of the event.

20. RESULTS

Results will be posted on the LINK provided as soon as it is available. A complete set of results will be e-mailed to all provinces after the last day of the championships. Results will only be available on the internet LINK provided during the Technical and Managers Meeting on 30 March 2022.
